#### Notes from the Executive Board



Dear Friends:

Since I last wrote to you, we have had two Board meetings. We have started

on a draft budget for the next fiscal year; this work will continue through every meeting until the annual meeting. <u>The date for the annual meeting</u> will be May 20. Please make a note of it.

Thanks to the efforts of Rich Mastronardi, Board liaison to Buildings and Grounds, a new committee structure has been put in place, and Eve Potts has volunteered to serve as coordinator and chair. Thanks to all who agreed to serve on the committee, and special thanks to Eve and Rich!

The Board has approved a request by a local Boy Scout, whose Eagle Scout project is to make historic sites in Medfield QR accessible. He asked for permission to mount a QR scan code on the front of our church, to allow people to view the church's history on their phones. He will be working with David Temple, president of the Medfield Historical Society, to develop a narrative about our history. A prototype plaque (yet to be approved by the town) looks like this:



The Board has also been discussing various building security issues. We decided that the locks on both the vestry and U-House doors will be changed and new keys issued, and the code in the vestry key box will be changed periodically. Announcement in all our messaging venues will be made prior to the actual changeover, and individuals who have or need keys should tell Sandra that they need a replacement. Keep your eyes peeled for news on this topic!

You should have received an invitation to attend the "Annual Fund Drive Kick-off Cook-off" on Saturday, March 17<sup>th</sup>, starting at 6 p.m. The Millis-Berfield Band, wildly applauded at its recent Expresso Yourself coffeehouse performance, will return to entertain us, and you can vote for the best chili made by our FPUU committees! So please put this date on your calendar as well.

Dear Members and Friends:

We are pleased to announce the theme of our Annual Fund Drive, which we believe reflects the promise and possibility of this vital time in the life of our First Parish Community. Our strengths are apparent in many ways:

- Our Ministerial Search Committee is diligently seeking our next settled minister and hopes to present a Candidate this spring for a Vote to Call by the Members;
- We enrolled five new Members in 2017, and our Annual Fund Drive last year drew 100% pledging participation by the households active in our congregation;
- Our historic Sanctuary gained a new digital sound system and wireless control board and up-to-date hearing assistance will be installed later this spring;
- Religious Exploration conducted an energetic "Candyland" Solstice service Dec. 17 in our Sanctuary, and is enthusiastically planning a Mar. 25 Spring Celebration service;

- We continue to enjoy excellent music, interesting Sunday and special worship services, youth activities, energetic committees, Expresso Yourself, inclusive pastoral care and a vibrant community that has recommitted to its characteristically optimistic fellowship.

We hope you reflect on how we as a First Parish family bolster one another and will build upon these strengths and many others as we look ahead to the coming year. Please celebrate with us on Saturday, Mar.17 at the "Kick-off Cook-off" in the Vestry. Food by our committees, music by the Millis-Berfield Band and the fun for all ages begins at 6:00 p.m. There is no charge.

Please plan to join us for the Annual Fund Drive Sunday Service the next day, Mar. 18. We will begin the formal pledging process at that time. Your participation is vital. Our Members and Friends take responsibility for all the expenditures necessary for First Parish to grow and thrive.

#### "HOW MUCH SHOULD I PLEDGE?"

Dear Members and Friends:

Each of us decides how much our household can support our church over the coming year. Financial support in any amount from every Member and Friend of First Parish is vital. Our congregation is entirely responsible for the church's expenses. Here is a pledge guideline:

#### Ways to Determine Your Pledge:

Your pledge in any amount is greatly appreciated. The UUA Fair Share Guide is a helpful resource for thinking about what your pledge amount is appropriate for you. The financial commitment levels in the Guide are suggestions that start at 2% of adjusted income, with giving levels rising with capacity. "Adjusted income" is your household income after paying taxes and medical expenses and items like tuition and elder or dependent care expenses.

- **Supporter:** The congregation is a significant part of my spiritual and intellectual life that I want to support. My fair share financial commitment starts at 2% of my income and rises to 6% as my income and capacity rise.
- **Sustainer:** The congregation is my central community; I am committed to sustaining the programs and ministries of my congregation. My fair share financial commitment starts at 3% of my income and rises to 7% as my income and capacity rise.
- **Visionary:** My commitment is a clear demonstration of the unique importance of this congregation and of my spiritual principles. My fair share financial commitment starts at 5% of my income and rises to 9% as my income and capacity rise.
- **Transformer**: I am deeply committed to the congregation; my contribution provides fuel for transformation and is part of my spiritual practices in living out my UU Principles. My fair share financial commitment represents 10% of my income.

We believe that if all of us pledged a minimum of 2% of our adjusted household income the Executive Board would be able to present at the Annual Meeting a balanced Church Budget for 2018-2019. Last year (for the 2017-2018 Budget), the Pledge Total was \$105,000 from 52 households. The average pledge was \$2,020. A 15% increase in the pledge average this year would raise about \$115,000, which would bring us very close to balance. Our Budget is stable, but we have been managing modest but persistent deficits in operations for some years. It is important to escape that cycle without damaging cuts to our programs, services and staff. We can do it!



# Our Annual Potluck Passover Seder Will be held on Friday, March 30<sup>th</sup> in the Vestry Starting at 6:00 PM All are invited to this family gathering



Passover is the celebration of the liberation of the Israelites from their slavery in the time of the Pharaohs, but for us it is much more than that. We celebrate it also as a celebration of the search for liberation for all people at all times.

A 'seder' is a telling of that story – you know, the one from the Bible, the one from movies – but with a UU flavor. We will all take turns reading parts, and then we will eat.

In years past we have had as many as 40 people together, and sometimes as few as 10 – but all are welcome to share food, read an old story, and maybe even sing a few songs.

If you would like to come, please drop us a note and tell us what you would bring (so we don't get five salads and no main courses). One note –there are some traditional foods which fit in to a Passover meal. Leavened products including certain grain-based foods like bread and pasta do not.
