
In addition, the annual fund drive people have come up with some new ideas about our pledge drive - and that's going to be engaging for us, as well.

As we mentioned last month, the two primary purposes of our Committee on Shared Ministry (COSM) are:

- To foster a healthy and supportive church environment through direct, open communication
- To help the people and committees involved in our different ministries in a supportive, future oriented self-assessment process.

In pursuit of these goals we are planning to help the committees of the church in a process of selfassessment to examine and report how they are actually functioning in relation to their objectives and the church's mission. First Parish is continuing on its path to reduce its carbon footprint and to educate people about the necessity to do so. During December, the lights in the Sanctuary were replaced with LED bulbs. Committee members continued to hand out antiidling flyers. We also want to help facilitate Medfield in joining 155 other MA towns as a Green Community which will provide \$148,000 in energy improvement grants to the town. The Medfield Energy Committee is encouraging community groups to attend the April Town Meeting to help approve the necessary steps. Medfield will be starting a solar farm in February.
