From the Reopening Task Force

Indoor Services to Resume on March 6

The Reopening Task Force is pleased to announce that indoor services will resume at First Parish on Sunday, March 6. The Task Force has been monitoring key data and is confident that conditions now allow for a safe return to in-person gatherings.

Attendees are reminded that all areas of the Meeting House and the U-House now have HEPA-level air filtration and circulation. Please note that all services will continue to be livestreamed on Zoom.

First Parish will continue to follow Covid procedures and protocols tailored to the current conditions as follows:

- Vaccinations are expected, or having had a negative Covid test in the previous 24 hours
- All attendees will be masked, including children during RE classes
- Social distancing will no longer be required, nor will there be a capacity limit in the meeting house; attendees are asked to be respectful of the personal space of others
- There will be no congregational singing
- Children will be welcome in the sanctuary for the beginning of the service as in the past. They will then leave for RE in the U-House
- Little Lights (childcare during the service) cannot be provided because of a staffing shortage. Parents are welcome to bring their children downstairs to the Little Lights corner
- A SOCIAL HOUR (sorry, no coffee or snacks) will take place in the vestry after the service
- Outdoor activities will not require masking

The Task Force will continue to monitor trends and will announce modifications as necessary and appropriate.



This is Robert D. Bullard, the person who spoke the words pictured on the left.

He is known as "the father of environmental justice." Born in Elba, Alabama in 1946, Bullard became a sociologist, educator, activist, advocate, and author. His interest and passion in the intersection of environmentalism and social justice was born in the late 1970's when he gathered data about garbage landfills of Houston, Texas. Blacks were 25% of the city's population, but 100% of the city-owned landfills were located in the middle of black neighborhoods. His studies revealed systematic injustices. He has gone on to campaign against numerous environmental injustices involving pollution, nuclear waste, storm preparation (or lack of), and more, while working with grassroots groups. He was instrumental in the creation of environmental justice policy at the federal level. Currently he is a distinguished professor of urban planning and environmental policy at Texas Southern University in Houston.

"If you're just talking about greenhouse gases and parts per million, you're not seeing the issues around vulnerability and justice."
