Executive Board Notes

Dear Friends:

The new church year has been off to a great start, with well-attended services and a Medfield Day blessed with perfect weather. Thanks to all who helped out!

The main purpose for this message is to <u>invite you</u> to a congregational mission retreat on Sunday, November 1, right after coffee hour, from 12-2. Babysitting and a pizza lunch will be provided. On that day, we would like to share with you the steps we have taken this past year, working our way from vision to mission, and preparing the ground for a process leading to a new strategic plan (a process we were also charged to develop at the Annual Meeting this past June).

The Executive Board held its annual fall retreat on September 20, splendidly facilitated by Mary Corthell (thank you, Mary!). Our goal was to finalize a draft for a mission statement and to begin developing a process that will lead us toward a new strategic plan.

The vision statement developed last year was: "A loving community committed to spiritual exploration and to a safe and welcoming world."

The mission statement we crafted on September 20, based on the open discussion meetings last spring, explains what it is we want to be working for: "We strive to live with deep respect and love for life, to embrace the challenge of human differences, to foster spiritual growth and to work toward a just and sustainable world, beginning with our own and nearby communities."

Using language suggested by meeting participants last spring, we also developed a further elaboration of the three concepts in the vision statement:

As a loving community looking both inward and outward, we will

- a) Practice seeing through the eyes of others
- b) Give of ourselves
- c) Treat others justly
- d) Acknowledge conflicts and work to resolve them promptly

In our spiritual exploration, we will

- a) Support each other on our intellectual and emotional journey
- b) Explore and practice how to live in accord with our shared values

 Seek to give meaning to our individual and collective lives

In our commitment to a safe and welcoming world, we will

- a) Work toward greater inclusiveness in our congregation and communities
- b) Engage for social and environmental justice
- Stand together as a sanctuary for independent thought and collective growth

On November 1, we hope to discuss with many of you how our vision and mission (the "what") can take us to a strategic plan (that lays out the implementation or the "how"). This is <u>your</u> church, and we hope that many of you will join us for this discussion.

A sign-up sheet will be posted in the vestry beginning next Sunday.

There is one other item I would like to share with you:

The church's cash flow is somewhat irregular, as not all pledges are being paid at regular (e.g., monthly) intervals. There is an easy remedy for this (that also saves work): to authorize a monthly online payment through your bank. If you set this up (which takes all of five minutes), the bank will automatically send a check to the church every month, and you never have to bother with writing a check. — I'll be happy to demonstrate how to do this: if you are interested, please send me an e-mail (ffleischmann@comcast.net), and I'll set up a date after coffee hour to show how it's done.

First Parish offers a youth group for high school students in area towns. Currently, our young people come




from Medfield, Dover, and Sharon. At a recent meeting the youth group voted to use some of the funds raised at Medfield Day for a UUA fundraiser:

to find the household items needed to set up living in an apartment.

The mission of NewLife Home Refurnishing is to distribute "gently used" household goods at no cost to individuals and families who need help to rebuild their lives. Our clients come to us through referrals from social service and government agencies, as well as area clergy.

Our goal is to treat our clients with dignity, providing them with a "shopping" opportunity to furnish their new home with the basic necessities from our inventory.

NewLife relies on the generosity of residents of Medfield and the surrounding towns. We accept most basic furniture and household items in good condition. Those who are downsizing or

redecorating can recycle their items, knowing they will be put to good use and kept out of landfills. Donations are tax deductible.

Committee on Shared Ministry

As with any community or family, sometimes issues and concerns arise at First Parish. This is normal. The important thing is how we deal with these issues. The purpose of the Committee on Shared Ministry (COSM) is to act as an impartial group, fostering a healthy and supportive environment through direct, open communication. Many, if not most, UU churches have Committees on Ministry.

FPUU members and friends are encouraged to contact any COSM member if they have concerns about the minister or ministries/committees in the church. The COSM member will listen non-judgmentally, make observations, and encourage direct communication with the involved parties. The COSM cannot be the messenger but will accompany anyone if additional support is required. In lieu of the ideal direct communication, active listening from a COSM member can prove helpful. Please don't let concerns fester or snowball. Contact anyone on the COSM. It's all part of being a member of our church family.

As outlined in the charter, the COSM is also responsible for assisting ministries/committees in a supportive, self-assessment process. The committee will select two ministries each year for review on a rotating basis starting this fall.

The COSM looks forward to deepening our relationships with all FPUU members and friends in the upcoming year. Please contact anyone on the committee with questions or concerns.
