# Ministerial Musings Dave Egan, Minister

After hearing about it from a colleague, this summer I signed up for the Clergy Pass offered by Fenway Park. This pass allows myself and a guest to attend any home Red Sox game for \$10-\$15 per game, and we often sit right up front between home and 1st base. Not too shabby. I have already been to seven games...and plan to go to a few more before the season ends. Pretty nice way to spend a warm summer evening.

With baseball on the brain, I took note when I rewatched the classic 1987 movie *The Untouchables*, staring Robert De Niro as Al Capone. You may remember his famous speech standing around a table filled with his henchmen:

"What is that which gives me joy? Baseball! A man stands alone at the plate. This is the time for what? For individual achievement. There he stands alone. But in the field, what? Part of a team. Teamwork... Looks, throws, catches, hustles. Part of one big team. Bats himself the live-long day, If his team don't field... what is he? You follow me? No one. I get nowhere unless the team wins."

Now if you have seen the movie, you know that this scene does not end well for one of Capone's minions, as he finds himself on the wrong end of Capone's baseball bat. But we won't talk about that part! What does resonate with me is this notion of both individual effort and teamwork, that both go hand-in-hand. There are times when we must take initiative and step up to the plate, and other times when we must collaborate and work together.... much like here at FPUU Medfield.

So as we begin another church year together, let us remember to cheer on and congratulate those who are willing to step into leadership and take a swing at the bat...even if sometimes they miss. And let us honor all of the fielders who run, dive, throw, and hustle to get the work done that needs to be done. For all of it is important work. All of it is generous. All of it is holy.


