The RE Committee is looking forward to working with Patricia as she awaits a permanent position.



#### **Ministerial Search Committee News**

Greetings from the Ministerial Search Committee! We have been busy since the end of the last church year.

We kicked off our work in June at a weekend retreat at the Bullard Memorial Farm in Holliston, MA, where we learned more about the search process and the Committee's responsibilities.

**Jen Bartle** is our fearless leader as Ministerial Search Committee Chairperson. She keeps us in line at meetings and keeps the Board informed of our progress.

Dan Bibel and Kirsten D'Abate are our Survey Coordinators. Over the past two months, with extensive input from the rest of the Committee members and other First Parishoners (thank you!) they have compiled a questionnaire for members of the congregation and friends. The survey is our data-gathering tool for you to tell us what you value about First Parish and in a minister. It also asks for demographic information that will allow us to paint an accurate portrait of First Parish for ministerial candidates.

We will use the information we collect to create a "packet" -- in the past it was a real packet or binder, but now it is a webpage about First Parish for ministerial candidates. **John Kornet**, as Packet Editor, will create the webpage. To get to this step in the process, we need you, FPUU members and friends, to complete the survey as soon as possible. Because of the personal nature of some of the questions, it is completely anonymous. It will take about 15 minutes to complete, and we would like all members and friends, including youths (16 years or older, or who have completed the Coming

When pre-candidates who have seen our packet express interest in First Parish, our Arranger Louise Rachin will coordinate the Committee's meetings with pre-candidates and our final candidate. David Temple is our Reference Checker, vetting candidates and representing the Committee on the negotiating team. Kirsten D'Abate is also our Treasurer; she tracks expenses related to the search (which, to protect the identities of the candidates, must be kept confidential).

I am the Committee Secretary, so you will see me in church most Sundays making announcements about our progress. Please ask any of us questions and let us know your opinions; the more open, honest information we have from you, the better we can do our jobs. The Committee must maintain complete confidentiality about the identities of the prospective ministers, but we will be updating you frequently about the work we have been doing.

On **October 28** we will have a special facilitated Sunday service and post-service workshop for the entire congregation called <u>Beyond Categorical Thinking</u>, which is designed "to promote inclusive thinking and help prevent unfair discrimination in the ministerial search process." We hope you can attend.

#### From the Music Director



Thanks to a scholarship awarded by the UUMN and the generous contributions of many members of First Parish Medfield

(spearheaded by Jen Bartle), I attended the 30th annual UUMN Conference this summer in Tulsa, Oklahoma! I wanted to express my appreciation for your support and to tell you how valuable the experience was for me as a musician, a composer, and your Music Director. I had attended the

conference in Boston four years ago, but I still felt in many ways like a first-timer.

I attended wonderful workshops, participated in the Conference Choir led by the dynamic Tim Seelig (conductor of the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus), and met many other amazing musicians. The host city of Tulsa was friendly, hospitable and gracious in all aspects (despite the 100+ degree weather every day!), and the staff and organizers of the conference were extremely welcoming and professional. Some of the outstanding workshops I attended included Involving Children in Worship, Conducting Seminars with Tim Seelig, and a workshop about lyrics with UU composer Elizabeth Alexander.

Although I was a little shy and new to networking during my first conference, this time I was excited to make the most of the experience! I was able to share my original music in several ways during the conference. I sang original songs in two of the Luncheon Recitals, where I performed along the amazing songwriter and harmonica player extraordinaire Hal Walker, whose choral music you will soon be hearing at our church, and Scott Roewe, band member of the Wild Colonials. I also participated in the annual Conference Choir and attended services held by the host church.

All Souls Unitarian Church is very interesting in that they have two styles of services. The first is a more traditional service and the second involves a Praise Choir, multimedia screens and sometimes dancing too! They have a very diverse and energized community, and impressively large and modern facilities.

The trip expanded my horizons, but also reinforced the idea of community. The local chaplain's fiancee was mentored at Andover-Newton by our former minister Rev. Bob McKetchnie. I met the new Music Director at the Sherborn church, the director of Arlington St. Church, and I was also happy to see Eric Stetson, FPUU member Jim Stetson's son, who is now a UU Music Director himself in California!

I have already seen direct results in my musical activities, thanks to attending the choir. Music Directors from several states including Kansas, Arizona, and Oklahoma have bought some of my scores to perform at their own churches. I also had a wonderful experience at the UU church in Hawaii. At the conference, I met Karen Valasek, the Music Director at the UU church in Hawaii where Chris and I were married five years ago, and we hit it off instantly! She loved the song "Be On Your Own Side" (co-written by Kelsey Chatterton) which I performed at one of the conference recitals, and since we were coming to Hawaii in August, she invited me to perform it at her church. It was performed at her church on Oahu with her band, which consisted of flute, bass, drums, cornet and singers as well as me on piano! One of her young singers from the church did a beautiful job singing the piece. She invited me back again in the future, and it is wonderful to feel like I have UU friends now in so many states!

I want to thank Jen Bartle, the Worship & Music Committee and the generous support of you, the FPUU community, for helping to make this amazing experience a reality for me! I am excited to share some new, beautiful music with the choir and congregation! I have learned more about the UU Music Director credentialing program, which I am interested to pursue more in the future, and I plan to make a point to attend next year's conference in Dallas! I am excited to share all I have learned, and hope to give back to you in music what you have helped me to experience!

#### Social Action/Social Justice

The end of summer is fast approaching bringing with it another challenging year. Gratefully the election madness will soon be past us and "things" can settle down for at least a little while. While the search for our new spiritual leader picks up, the basic work of the church continues and it's time to think about the social action of the church.

The committee needs members to help plan how FPUU will direct its attention in social action endeavors. We normally meet one evening a month for an hour and 1/2 to talk about how we can direct our attention and which of the many worthy projects will benefit the most by our limited time and resources. Each year we try to help the local community, the wider area (metrowest) community and the urban community and act globally as well.

Locally, we contribute to the **food pantry, the pet pantry,** and provide gifts to the food pantry at Christmas plus "share the plate" from the Christmas Eve service with area food pantries. For the latter, our contributions have gone for fuel assistance.

For the metrowest community, we have worked with other churches to provide temporary shelter including three meals a day for homeless people with children. This organization is now operating nationwide and is growing. This project has many

needs and there are all sorts of ways we can help contributing whatever time we have to share.

Serving the urban UU community, we volunteer for special events at the UU Urban Ministry as well as teach English as a second language once a week during the Boston school year and during the summer. For those who are fortunate to do this, we find this effort extremely rewarding.

Other projects come up from time to time and we are willing to support anyone who wants to take the lead on a special project. Please let us know and we will help publicize your social action event.

#### June 2012 Annual Meeting Summary

- Election of Officers, Board Members and Nominating Committee:
  - o Cissy Hull-Allen and Sara Drumm At-Large Board, 2-year terms.
  - o Duncan Glover Vice-Chair, 2-year term
  - o Ann Cunningham Communications Clerk, 2-year term
  - Buck Buchanan Treasurer, 1-year term (Buck resigned in August and Glen D'Abate was appointed to finish his term).
  - o Julie DeSorger and Bill Wians co-chairs nominating committee, 1 year terms.
- A budget for the 2012-2013 Church year was presented, discussed and passed. Expenses of \$157,041 against income of \$150,440 resulted in a \$6,601 deficit. The budget was bare bones plus 2.7% salary increases for staff.
- The Membership Committee proposed that a new sign be installed for First Parish. A lively discussion of the Wayside Pulpit ensued so no decision was reached. The new sign proposal will be revised to include the relocation of the Wayside Pulpit to an appropriate location. The sign is to be paid for by donations from the membership.
- By-Law amendments were proposed as follows:
  - o Article 2 PURPOSE was replaced with Article 2 MISSION:
    - Article 2.1 To affirm and promote the Seven Principles of Unitarian Universalism.
    - Article 2.2 To maintain and support a dynamic and welcoming congregation.
  - Article 2.3 To provide opportunities for spiritual growth, religious education and pastoral care to our congregation.
    - Article 2.4 To serve and contribute to surrounding communities and the world with compassion, charity and good citizenship.
  - Article 2.5 This congregation affirms and promotes the full participation of persons in all our activities and endeavors including membership, programming, hiring practices, and the calling of religious professionals, without regard to race, color, gender, gender identity and expression, physical or mental ability, affectational or sexual orientation, class or national origin."
    - O Article 3.2.1 Member Current By-Law states a member "..makes a minimum financial contribution set by the Executive Board." The Board proposed that it be decided by vote to either require members make a minimum financial contribution of \$77 (UUA + MBD dues) or no financial contribution. After much discussion and counter proposals, the motion was tabled and referred back to the EB. In the June EB meeting, in accordance with the existing By-Law, the Board voted to set the minimum financial contribution at the UUA plus MBD dues which for this year will be \$77. No further action is required.
    - o <u>Article 3.3.4 Absences</u> was amended to clarity the time of inactivity to 24 months before removing from the membership rolls.

- o Article 7.1.1 Staff was amended to increase the vote for calling a new minister from 2/3 to 90%.
- A discussion of a statement affirming FPUU as a Welcoming Congregation was held. The EB was directed to schedule a "Town Meeting" for discussion in October. The agreed statement would be subject to approval at a later Parish meeting.
