News and Views from the RE Desk Patricia Hatch, Interim Director of Religious Education

Many of you know that the children often have their own worship service on Sundays. A few weeks ago, I included part of this quote from a theoretical physicist, Lawrence Krauss: "Every atom in your body came from a star that exploded. And, the atoms in your left hand probably came from a different star than your right hand. It really is the most poetic thing I know about physics: You are all stardust. You couldn't be here if stars hadn't exploded, because the elements - the carbon, nitrogen, oxygen, iron, all the things that matter for evolution and for life - weren't created at the beginning of time. They were created in the nuclear furnaces of stars, and the only way for them to get into your body is if those stars were kind enough to explode...The stars died so that you could be here today."

The children really seemed to find this quote interesting and enjoyed talking about it. So I decided that I would share it in this month's newsletter. What does it mean that we are made of stardust? To me, it is both exciting and grand and also humbling. It also shows again how much we are a part of the interconnected web. Stardust is not just "out there;" it is also "in here."

What else is "not just out there?" Love, peace, justice, creativity? What about divinity? Now that we know that stardust is inside us, maybe we can learn to see more clearly that we already have our highest ideals in our hearts. May we — and our children — learn to live more fully in the light of this knowledge.

Executive Board Notes

The Executive Board Meeting was held on April 25th.

- Ministerial Search: The Ministerial Search Committee has selected Meg Soens as the candidate for settled minister at First Parish UU Medfield. Meg will be in the Pulpit on April 28 and May 5. To get to know Meg, a full agenda of meetings, gatherings and social events has been published for the time between April 28 and May 5. Every FPUU member should plan to attend one of these get-togethers. A Parish Meeting is scheduled to follow the service at 11:30 on May 5 to vote on acceptance of Meg Soens to be the settled minister for First Parish.
- First Parish Annual Meeting is scheduled for June 2. There will be elections for Chair, Treasurer and two At-Large positions on the Executive Board. The Nominating Committee Chair will also be open. If you are interested in a Board position, please contact Bill Wians or Julie DeSorger. The last service for the year is June 9.

Committee Changes:

*Social Action activities will continue at FPUU outside the traditional committee structure. Green Sanctuary has been chartered as a separate committee. Activities such as Family Promise network, Urban Ministry ESL tutoring, Food Pantry, Walk for Hunger will operate independently by the people interested in those causes. All Social Action activities are encouraged to seek help from the Executive Board as needed.

*Religious Education has been asked by the Executive Board to take responsibility for ensuring Child Care during Worship Service. RE has the knowledge of the Church youth interested in child care. It is recommended that the schedule of youth responsible for child care be posted in the vestry and website similar to the coffee hour list.

*Chancel Committee responsibilities will be absorbed under the Music and Worship Committee.

- ❖ Yard Sale: The 8th annual Indoor Yard Sale netted over \$2000 so far. There are several pieces of antique furniture and several boxes of china, silver plate and art glass that will be put out for consignment sale.
- Annual Fund Drive for Next Year: To date, pledges have been received from 22 of the 58 pledge units. The life of First Parish depends upon everyone contributing their fair share. PLEASE return your pledge cards sooner rather than later.
- Pledge Collections for 2013: To date, only \$90,100 of the \$117,500 pledged has been received. If you are behind in your pledge, please catch up. Dawn will be sending out pledge status reports soon.
- Wireless News: No change since the February report. Waiting for MetroPCS to file with the Town.

A service celebrating the life of Sally Adams was held on Saturday, April 27 at First Parish. Revs. Richard Stower and Fayre Stephenson led the service. Sally was raised in this church as a young girl and was married here to Dwight Adams in 1943. APPLICATION FOR SIGNS APPROVED – DONATIONS REQUESTED

The FPUU Sign Committee is pleased to report that the Town of Medfield Sign Advisory Board has formally approved our application for the following two signs:

1. A new sign (see rendering below) that will be placed at the approximate location of the existing Wayside Pulpit in front of the Church and UHouse. The new sign, to be constructed of High Density Urethane mounted on 6"x6" granite posts, will be double-sided and face perpendicular to North Street. Total installed cost is \$4,425 including an additional "drop" to replace the "Worship Service Sunday 10:00 AM..." drop during summer months. The existing Wayside Pulpit will be demolished.

2. A replica of the existing Wayside Pulpit that will be placed at the location of the signposts (where we advertise our yard sales and other events) along North Street on the south side of the church driveway. The replica, to be constructed of wood and PVC materials with message boards enclosed in hinged Plexiglas, will also be double-sided and face perpendicular to North Street. Total installed cost is \$2,600. The existing signposts will be demolished, but the capability to advertise yard sales and other events at this location will continue.

The total project cost for the two signs is \$7,025. To date, a total of \$4,250 in donations has been raised through personal contact with Members.

The FPUU Sign Committee requests your donation to help raise an additional \$2,775 to complete the project. Please make your check payable to First Parish Medfield, write "Sign Donation" in the comment line, and return to First Parish Medfield, 26 North Street, Medfield MA 02052. Your generosity is much appreciated.
